FROM OUR PARISH PRIEST

Dear Friends,

Today is PENTECOST SUNDAY and it brings to a close the Easter Season for 2025. The Red Vestments worn by the priest at Mass denote the "fire" of the Holy Spirit who continues to sustain the Church and the world as *the Lord, the Giver of Life* as we profess each Sunday in the Creed. Father Terry remarked the other day that when he recently celebrated a class Mass at our school he discovered that in that class alone the children spoke more than twenty languages. So we see the rich diversity alive and active in our Parish School but also in our Sunday Masses. The "face" of our Parish on Sundays is increasingly a rich and diverse one with many cultures forming a beautiful tapestry of unity-in-diversity and all this is made possible by the life-giving presence of the Holy Spirit. This is the meaning of today's Feast of Pentecost and if it is true that our parish is already a *family for all* we also know that like each of us it is still a work in progress. We ARE a family for all but we are always GROWING MORE as a family for all. And you are part of that. There is no parish *apart from you*; rather, YOU are the parish (along with so many others). *Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love!*

The USE OF INCENSE in Christian worship has its roots in the Bible itself and is one of the many taonga (or treasures) that make our worship beautiful and engages our whole selves (our five senses of taste, touch, sight, smell and hearing) in giving honour and praise to Almighty God. It's fragrance adds solemnity and mystery to our Sunday worship but we don't use it all the time or at every Mass. Thank you for your patience as we have been experimenting a bit with its usage at the 9.00am Sunday Mass. Many of you have expressed appreciation for this restoration of such a rich symbol of the mysterious and beautiful presence of God. At that same time we hear you when you say that it has an honoured place but need not be used EVERY Sunday at 9.00am and why don't we use it instead of always at 9.00am but at the occasional Saturday evening or Sunday evening Mass instead. That depends on the availability of experienced Altar Servers of course, but we hear you. The use of Incense at 9.00am Mass will be perhaps when the Parish Choir sings, or for special occasions etc but not every single Sunday. And if we can, we might give Saturday night or Sunday night parishioners the chance to receive this blessing. I often quote the saying less is more to people - and that applies to most good things - use in moderation and spread the joy. Thank you for your greatly appreciated feedback on how you like Incense at Mass some of the time but not all of the time.

We extend our prayerful sympathy to the families of *Mary Downie, John Fleming, and Bill Back-* all parishioners who have died in the last week or so. May they rest in peace.
